MONARCHIES FOCUS ON BOUGAINVILLE

People attending a recent gathering at Tonu on south west Bougainville, have been told that there are monarchies throughout the world, who are focusing their attention on Bougainville as a new nation under the leadership of the Royal Twin Kingdom governments.

Thirty-One such monarchies are focusing their attention on the island nation and are on standby to assist both financially or otherwise.

This is the word from the King of Meekamui, His Royal Highness King Francis Domanaa when addressing several hundred people at the Royal Kingdom of Papala House of Assembly on Friday the 10th of June during one of his regular visits to parts of the island nation.

His Royal Highness, told the people that the fact that only 3% of the eligible voters on Bougainville voted in the May Autonomous Government elections means that the remaining 97% support his government, and as such, it is the only government they can turn to, to advance their push for development regardless of various differences.

King Francis assured people at the gathering that his government has the money and resources to be able to bring about tangible development that many Bougainvilleans have been waiting for, under previous conventional governments.

He told the people that an independent Bougainville under his Meekamui Government, was their only hope for lasting peace and harmony and tangible development, that no other government can guarantee on the island nation.

PNG GOVT LETTER TO UN QUESTIONED

The letter by PNG's controversial minister for Foreign Affairs, Sir Rabbie Namaliu informing the

Secretary General of the United Nations in New York, Kofi Annan of his government's wish for it not to recognize the Meekamui Government on Bougainville, seems to be in vain.

In recent communications between the head of the World Bank in New York and the King and President of the Meekamui Government, His Royal Highness King Francis Domanaa, the bank advised that it recognizes his government's existence and is on standby to provide financial assistance, in the event that it may need such help.

The Meekamui government of King Francis Domanaa has not and does not wish to seek any financial assistance from the World Bank and questions are being asked in some parts of Bougainville on the authenticity of the letter by Sir Rabbie Namaliu and if it actually represents his government's line of thinking.

Riding on the applause he created by revealing these matters, King Domanaa stressed that his government has no plans to compromise the existence of the people of Bougainville to any foreign governments and organizations as long as he is in office as the King of the Royal Kingdom of Meekamui and President, of the Government of Meekamui.

AUTONOMOUS GOVT. FUNDS APPEAL CAN GET LOCAL ASSISTANCE

The appeal by the newly elected Autonomous Government of Bougainville for much needed operational funds from citizens living outside of the island, can be realized if those behind the appeal can forget their differences and ask for assistance from their much criticized Royal Twin Kingdoms of Meekamui and

Papala. Courtesy of the Royal Kingdom of Papala's monetary and banking system, U-Vistract through their banking arm, the Royal International Bank of Meekamui, the Meekamui government of President and King, His Royal Highness King Francis Domanaa was allocated K440 Billion in budgetary allocation in May to fund its operations for the second half of 2005 and over the 2006 financial year.

If the commitment by His Royal Highness, King Francis can be taken as a guide on his government's ongoing intention to ensure delivery of services and development to Bougainvilleans is enhanced, such a request for much needed operational funds by the autonomous government stands a good chance, of being considered.

What will be needed though is for all parties involved to forget their various differences and work together for the common good of their people, if they have their people's development needs at heart.

With such an abundant supply of available funds, one wonders why leaders of the cash strapped autonomous government of Bougainville should be looking for financial assistance from other sources, other than from their own homegrown Royal Twin Kingdoms of Meekamui and Papala.

UV CENTRAL PAYOUT OFFICES

Work is progressing smoothly to set up overseas regional and national Central Payout Offices in Solomon Islands, Fiji, Vanuatu, and PNG's 100,000 plus investors in the Royal Kingdom of Papala's monetary and banking system, U-Vistract.

In PNG, the payout to be conducted under the watchful supervision of U-V's PNG Clients' Chairman, Sir Joe Tikson, will be made by several bankers from the Tonu based Royal International Bank of Meekamui.

Sir Tikson, who was in Tonu earlier this week said his committee of Port Moresby based UV investors, hopes the office when identified will be set up and equipped to be ready to make this payout, by July.

He stressed that the office is being set up to specifically handle payout of investors' funds and as such, WILL NOT be taking any deposits or handle any funds from existing or intending helpers.

Bankers expected to be involved in the payout are career bankers formerly employed by a number of PNG's commercial banks prior to joining the Royal International Bank of Meekamui at Tonu.

All of them have been quietly involved in setting up the bank's operations at Tonu as a payout bank since January and were directly responsible for opening up 10,000 plus bank accounts and bank cards for PNG helpers to the system.

These bankers are among a team of 20 plus overseas nationals who now work for the RKP and U-Vistract at its international headquarters at Tonu, on the south west of Bougainville Island.

DIRECTOR'S COLUMN

Welcome once again to Director's Column this week.

Over the past two weeks I briefly touched on the issues of 'independence' and 'sovereignty'. We saw that in the mindset of our colonizers 'independence' is merely 'a degree of freedom within their international control system'. We also saw that 'independence' is by grant whereas 'sovereignty' is by proclamation and action.

Today I wish to briefly touch on the concepts of "Autonomy" and "Independence".

Here in Bougainville we have a couple of 'independence movements' or governments on the ground. On the one hand we have the autonomous government that attempts to gain so-called independence through PNG whilst on the other hand we have the Meekamui government that stands on its unilateral declaration of independence of May 17, 1990. The former has just conducted an election to legalize its existence whilst the latter has depended on customary laws to justify its existence. I normally say that the former is legal under foreign introduced laws whilst the latter is lawful under our customary laws that existed since time-immemorial.

Autonomous government leaders believe that there is no way Bougainville can gain independence outside of PNG. They argue that independence can only be granted by PNG alone. However, the Meekamui government believes that Bougainville gained her independence by a unilateral proclamation made on May 17, 1990.

In the mindset of U-Vistract leadership, both autonomous and independence mindsets are forms of "foreign slavery". There's not much difference between them. The main difference is in the degree of freedom they offer our people. Autonomous governance is granted by PNG whereas independence is granted by an international government like United Nations. Both are by grant; and wisdom says he who grants powers to another is the Master and he who receives it is the Servant /slave.

When it comes to Bougainville, U-Vistract is more concerned with our national sovereignty and international government rather than mere autonomy or independence. We don't want autonomy or independence that is granted by foreign powers whether it's PNG or UN. It's a waste of time talking about autonomy or independence without setting up our own sovereign international government, finance or banking system. Sovereignty cannot be granted by PNG or UN. It comes directly from God above. No one else has the power to grant us sovereignty or international governance. Instead of bowing down to the UN we had to establish RAONK (Royal Assembly of Nations & Kingdoms) and invite other nations, kingdoms and governments as members. Our global banking system consists of 24 world banks. We have already begun granting powers to several nations, kingdoms and governments. **DIRECTOR**
