## PNG PM, Somare, seeks dialogue with U-V

The Papua New Guinea Government has started dialogue with the U-Vistract organization— which could be deemed a breakthrough for both PNG and Bougainville.

This follows a grant of a K100 billion from U-Vistract to PNG, seen as much needed funds to break-away from the slavery of borrowings from the foreign controlled conventional system.

“The Prime Minister’s officers contacted my office, informing that he (Sir Michael Somare) wanted to talk to me, and I told them to talk to my Prime Minister or my Governor General first”, said the U-V Principal Director and King of the Papala Kingdom on Bougainville, HM King David Peii II.

“I have appointed my chief governor for PNG, Sir James Wangi, and Governor General, Sir Iairo Lasaro, and they should talk to them”, said the King.

However, King Peii II said he is satisfied that the PNG government has realized the work being done by U-V to establish the U-V Government and Monetary system in PNG and other countries around the world.

“If discussions for financial grants to PNG are finalized, they will be third after Solomon Islands and the United States to finalize agreements with us”, he said.

He said the agreement with the USA was signed on the 19th of April 2004, for USD 3 billion, while the Solomon Island agreement is for SID350 million.

“In 2002 it took Solomon Islands

Government 6 weeks to investigate funds we have, before signing agreements with us”, he said. *pc*

## Open Up Accounts Now

Royal International Bank of Meekamui, with its payout offices throughout PNG and Bougainville are now ready to open personal savings, and other types of bank accounts.

And, customers have been assured that their monthly interest will be very much higher than the commercial banks.

Principal Director of U-Vistract which owns the RIBM, HM King David Peii II, who has directed the cease of money

collections from helpers to open helpers accounts, says the U-V through its agencies including the RIBM is now ready to help people, and they must open normal accounts to benefit from its services.

RIBM has 21 account types with interest ranging from 10% to 20%, some of which are Access, Surplus, Privy, savings, personal savings, company, Founding Members, and Royal International Classic, while it’s high yield Trade Products are *(cont page 3)*

# PNG urged to Check its Conscience

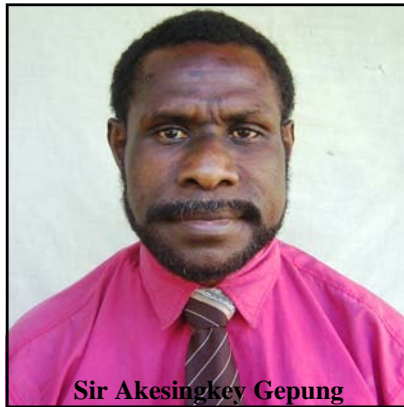

**Papua New Guinea authorities who have unsuccessfully tried everything in their power to stop operations of the Royal Kingdom of Papala's monetary and banking system, U-Vistract, since 1999, have been called on to decide if their actions were in the best interest of all citizens.**

Directing the call at the PNG central bank, the national court and the police force, recently installed UV Finance Governor for Morobe province and Head of the Royal Priestly Order of Melchizedek Worldwide, Sir Akesinkey Gepung questioned whether authorities concerned were upholding the law that put them into power, or the birthright of their people?

Attempts to date have been in vain and he stressed that they will never succeed, regardless of what they do.

Sir Akesinkey questioned if these organizations see the ongoing sufferings by Papuan New Guineans whose rights to

prosperity in their God given naturally rich nation, is being denied as a direct result of their counter actions.

"Do you wish to help the progress of the work of the U-Vistract which your citizens and nation as a whole can remember you by or do you wish to continue to stop the prosperity of what is founded on the foundation of creation for the divine purpose of God?", Sir Akesinkey, further questioned.

On any further attempts by these PNG organizations to try to stop the operations of U-Vistract, Sir

Akesinkey said all their attempts will fail.

He said U-Vistract will continue to prosper because it is founded by God to serve his people and his church on earth and no one and no amount of power by any forces on earth, can stop it from prospering.

Sir Akesinkey reiterated that the decision on how to handle progress of U-Vistract's development in PNG is up to these organizations, but if they allow it to progress unhindered, they would have done good for all humanity as God's plan will come to pass, whether we like it, or not. *pc*

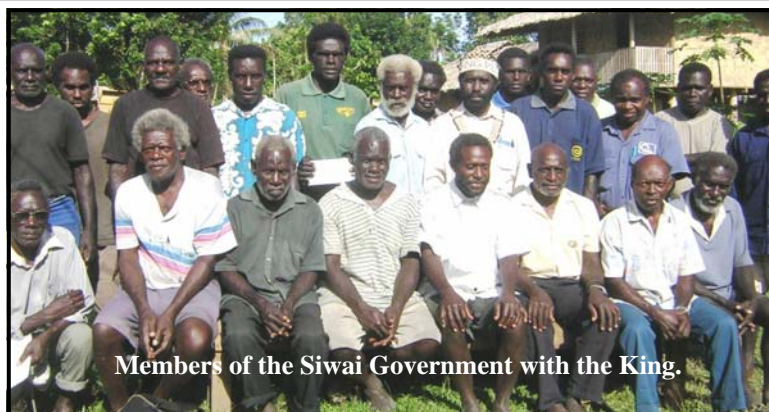
## SIWAI LEADERS FRAME DISTRICT BUDGET

**A team of planners including village chiefs and community based Meekamui government officials recently completed framing the first ever Siwai District budget to be funded by the U-Vistract under its financial year which commenced on the 1st of July.**

Work on framing the first ever Siwai District budget will set the frame work for similar work on formulating budgets for all of PNG's 19 provinces which have been allocated K4 Billion each for the twelve months commencing July this year.

Appointed UV Administrators for PNG provinces will be required to implement their budgets according to strict bible based guidelines to ensure all their

# Referendum Depends on Proof of Governance

Autonomous weakness is strength for Meekamui

**"Without money to deliver services, repair damaged infrastructures and compensate all loses incurred in the crisis, the Autonomous Government is bound to fail to show proof of good governance", says prominent lawyer and Prime Minister of the Meekamui Government on Bougainville, Hon Rueben Siara.**

"And, proof of good governance is the condition of the 2001 Peace Agreement to hold a referendum to decide the future destiny of Bougainville", says Mr Siara who was chief advisor to the late King Francis O.D.D. Domanaa, and Joseph Kabui, the current Autonomous President during the crisis.

"As far as I'm concerned, the Peace Agreement has failed, because (Joseph) Kabui failed to secure funding from stake holders to ensure his Government successfully restore all damages and compensate all loses - proving good governance", he said.

He said the Parliament of Papua New Guinea is bound to say the autonomous government failed, and refuse to allow the referendum to go ahead.

"In fact, I saw a paper circulating amongst PNG parliamentarians to deem autonomy a failure and

disallow the referendum, due to demand for autonomy by other provinces", he said.

He said President Kabui should have secured enough funds from stake holders of the agreement, the United Nations and the Commonwealth countries of Australia and New Zealand for restoration work and compensation.

"Thinking that PNG Government will give sufficient funds through the provincial grants was a mistake, because PNG will gradually put on the squeeze to strangle Bougainville", he said.

"The autonomous heading for failure, is the strength for Meekamui", he said.

He said Mr Kabui has lost the vision for a sovereign Bougainville, because he is a consensus man and not a man with a long term vision for Bougainville.

"With-out money his government will fail, and there will not be a referendum to decide the future of Bougainville", he said.

"Meekamui maintains the original vision and spirit in standing for and pushing for self rule as a sovereign nation for Bougainville", said the Meekamui Prime Minister.

IBD (20%), Treasury Bills (50%) and High Yield (100%) a month. ("We are not doing this to make money from conventional banks, which are only shams using and making money from peoples money entrusted into their hands", says the King.

"Our system is geared towards putting money into the hands of people, because it is based on principles of distribution, plenty, abundance and prosperity, while theirs is based on greed, lack and selfishness", he said.

"RIBM, through its payout offices in PNG and Bougainville plus the main Bank at Tonu are now ready to accept customers to open up their accounts", says the King.

The King said in the last issue of this paper that the helpers funds repaid with interest is one off, and those wanting to continue benefiting from U-V and its agencies should open up new accounts with them. pc

## Port Moresby & Rabaul to Trial Payouts

PNG's Port Moresby and Rabaul will be the next to test the payout system of the U-Vistract system.

Madang was the first in PNG with the trial payouts locally in the Siwai and Bana areas.

Announcing this, Principal Director of U-V, HM King David Peii II, said forms were taken to Port Moresby by the Chairman, Meshach Autahe, while the Rabaul, co-ordinator, Simon Laisi, also took forms for the Rabaul office.

"The forms must be completed of the amount of school fees they need, plus monies they need to pay their helpers", he said.

"Cheques will be released to them, when their completed forms are returned", he said.

He said one of the cheques issued to Madang has already been received at the Port Moresby central payout office, and work is going ahead to release the cash in the normal banking procedures", he said.

A total of five cheques were issued to Madang for the re-imbusement of some assistance payments, plus for the school fees of the children of about 7-thousand U-V clients.

# TONU BIG ON U-V HELPERS LIST

**Tonu based helpers to the U-Vistract monetary and banking system through the Royal International Bank of Meekamui now account for the biggest number of helpers to the organization on Bougainville Island.**

Of the 6,620 helpers to the organization on Bougainville, 3048 are from the Tonu and Bana areas, Arawa, 1888 , Buka , 1212 , Buin, 302 and Torokina, 170.

All these helpers men, women and children already have bank cards and bank statements

Along side these individual helpers are 4 village governments and 34 elementary schools.

Some of these elementary schools have become the first

direct recipients of financial assistance from UV towards the cost of outstanding school fees, teaching aids and building materials for school facilities.

Where parents had already paid for children's school fees they were given refunds for what ever they paid.

Similar assistance is soon to be extended to the Primary schools .

# Airlink to be Purchased by U-Vistract

**U-Vistract System has begun negotiations to acquire PNG's largest third level airline, Airlink .**

The negotiations are being carried out by the Governor for Royal World Insurance, Sir Marshall Kemba, with the owners of Airlink on behalf of U-V.

"It is amongst our priorities and first amongst our list of project activities to acquire the airline due to need for transportation access", says the U-V Principal Director, HM King David Peii II.

The purchase price of K50 million has already been settled between Airline and U-V, while the

negotiations are being held to settle other matters including the management.

"We hope to lease one of the aircrafts to do our courier runs while negotiations are continuing",

said the king.

Airlink owner/Manager, Cole Barbner, and Sir Marshall are expected to arrive soon on the first flight into Tonu.

## Royal World Insurance Starts

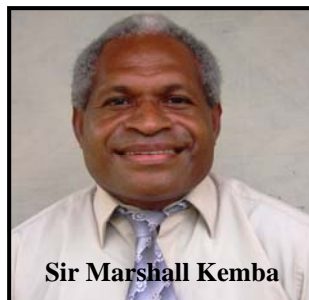

# The Birth of a New Era

## Cross Over to Promise Land

**The death of Late HM King Francis O D D Domanaa, is signaling something new for the twin Kingdoms of Meekamui and Papala, and the National Meekamui Government.**

Could it mean the birth of a new era, when both Kingdoms should amalgamate to streamline the operations as one head of State and one National Meekamui Government for Bougainville?

This question is no doubt in the minds of all the Meekamui leaders, and HM King David Peii II, of the Papala Kingdom and his counterpart and clansman, the Acting Head of State of the Meekamui Kingdom, Hon. John Taruna.

HM King Peii told "Papala Chronicles" on several occasions that they hope to meet soon with Hon. Taruna, and the Central Council of Chiefs to come to an understanding on ways they could work together.

The sooner both groups meet to hammer out this matter, the sooner they can settle down to the issues of governance, especially in implementing the gigantic K440 billion budget, the largest Bougainville has ever dreamed of having, which is about par with the budgets of the most developed countries in the world.

The issue of possible amalgamation of both Kingdoms

should be easy because both Heads of State, HM King Peii II and Hon. John Taruna are both related and come from the same "Eagle" clan.

"We are both from the Eagle clan, and will be able to work well together", said HM King Peii II.

Another new threshold for Bougainville, in the Chain of events greatly influenced by God Almighty, is what HM King Peii described as the "cross-over to the Promised Land", describing his return back home to Tonu to establish his Kingdom Headquarters, plus the headquarters of the U-Vistract Government, Monetary and Banking system.

"I have tried to establish the U-V system in PNG, Solomon Islands, and even at Guava, Panguna, but God always showed me that eventually I will return home to Tonu to establish it at Home", says the King.

My return to Tonu, on the invitation of the Tonu council of Chiefs was the "cross-over to the Promise Land", he says.

Writing in the "King's Corner" column of this

paper in the last issue, the King said that a Prophet, Brian Hayes, on a visit to Panguna last year, prophesied that "you are about to leave the time of Moses and enter into the period of Joshua and Caleb".

"The time of Moses has just lapsed with the passing away of late King Francis O.DD. Domanaa, and Bougainville has just crossed over to the "time of Joshua and Caleb", he said.

His returning home to Tonu after much "hard training for wisdom" was the fulfillment of many such prophecies spoken along the way.

Not many people realize that when God is on the move, and working through covenant people, there is no obstacle that is too big that can stand in the way to stop it.

When God was ready to move out the children of Israel out of slavery, Egypt in all its might and glory could not stop it.

The giants that stood in the way of this activity like the Ramsi Force, PMC, provincial politicians, PNG national finance systems and local critics are shutting up or going down one by one to pave way for it.

East New Britain Hardware Governor, Sir Joe Ben, says the imminent monetary pay-out of the U-Vistract system should put everyone into business – making the economic future of both Papua New Guinea and Bougainville to be looking very bright.

But, he said this depends on the intelligent use and investment in good profitable business activities of individuals who will be getting large sums of money.

"Even the money allocations to each provincial governors under the U-Vistract system is such that within a few years PNG and Bougainville will shoot into being amongst the developed nations of the world", said Sir Joe.

To avoid misuse, the Bank plans to use a system where-by people will not get and handle large sums of money, but will be required to obtain invoices and quotations for things they want, and cheques will be written to the suppliers.

# Widows Appreciate Fees

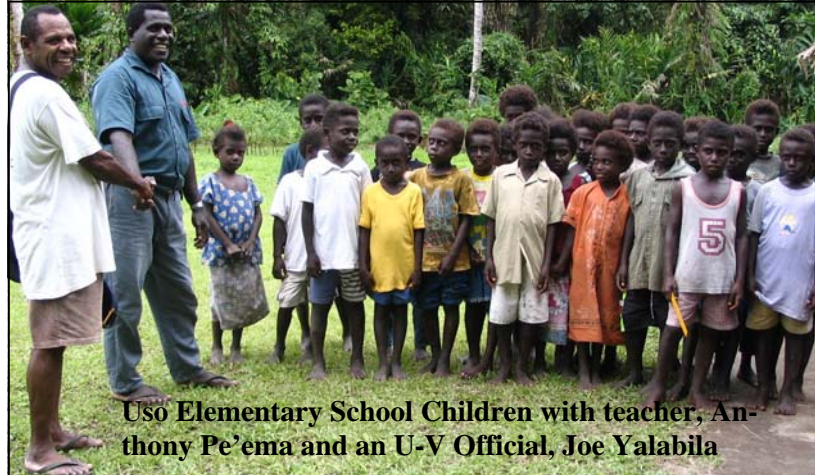

"The little market we do can not make enough money to cover our school fees", she said.

## RKP COMPANY REGISTRAR STILL GROWING

The number of companies already registered under the Royal Kingdom of Papala's Office of the Registrar of Companies can best be described as growing by the day.

From a humble beginning of just five companies between the 12<sup>th</sup> of February when the office first opened for business and the 25<sup>th</sup> of April the number of companies and the different lines of business they are involved in has recorded a steady increase.

From just the simple village based trade stores which sought and were given registration in the early stages of the office's activities, this has grown to include

a wide range of companies providing all lines of products.

In the five months from the 26<sup>th</sup> of April to the 19<sup>th</sup> of August the office has now registered more than 96 companies which apart from village trade stores now also include service stations, car dealers, a shipping company, wholesale shops, a health and engineering services and a legal firm.

When the RKP International Trade and Commerce System goes into full operations supporters, helpers and investors to the U-Vistract Monetary and Banking System can obtain goods and services from these

companies just by simply using their bank cards.

Registered companies with the RKP Registrar of companies which provided services to such clients can in turn approach the Royal International Bank of Meekamui with records of the customers bank card numbers and obtain cash for the services they provide.

Of the more than 96 companies already registered with the RKP Registrar of Companies, 2 car dealers, a legal firm, a health and engineering service company and a housing construction and supply company are owned by non Bougainvilleans. *Pc*

# Personal From HM King David Peii II

## HOW TO KILL GIANTS!

Welcome once again to King's Column! Last week we saw how God has begun removing giants before us as we advance. We also saw that the rate at which God will drive them out depends on our rate of progress on the ground.

In this week's column I'd like to discuss how easy it is to kill giants. There are many ways to kill giants and I'll just mention a few. Firstly, giants are very big in size. They are also very tall, clumsy, heavy and cumbersome. They cannot run through small, narrow and tiny openings and passages. People fear them because of their size but experienced giant-killers would normally run around under their legs and exhaust them before killing them. If a giant is chasing you the best technique is to run through some narrow pathways where the heavy, huge, tall, clumsy and cumbersome enemy cannot fit into.

I realized this when I was overseas single-handedly fighting against various national and international giants of the conventional system - governments, organizations, banking & financial institutions such as Central Banks, ASIC, WB, IMF, UN, CIA, etc. In the process of time I was able to notice their strengths and weaknesses and fight a good fight for my people. Many people think it is impossible to escape the so-called "long arm of the conventional governments". However, God's arm is longer and is able to cover and protect us all the time!

In the Bible one of the techniques that young David used to escape the long arm of the government of King Saul was to escape into Israel's enemy territory - Philistine. In one case young David pretended to be mentally-retarded when he was brought before the King of Philistine. He did it so well such that the king



believed him to be truly of unsound mind and therefore disregarded his presence in the land.

On October 19<sup>th</sup> 1999 in one of my trips to Australia the ASIC placed me under house-arrest, confiscated and impounded all my documents, banking information, worldwide network, etc, and thought that I was now unable to proceed with my operations. After a heavy interrogatory session they demanded me to shut down all my operations in the country. The ASIC publicized the matter in the media to let the world of Australia know about the so-called illegal operations. However, U-Vistract grew even stronger, gaining momentum almost overnight. The number of my agencies grew in Kempsey, Sydney, Brisbane, Gold coast, etc. The secret to defeating giants cannot be learned in a classroom. It comes by direct revelation from God above.

The Australian public, especially churches, NGOs and Christians continued investing large funds because of deeper personal convictions that U-Vistract was of God. In Kempsey, NSW, I donated a large 3-storey building block to the local churches and NGOs to be used for meetings. Such hard evidence made the Christian community even more convinced such that some churches even pestered me to set up my offices within their yards. The ASIC /government just could not dissuade them from their personal beliefs and convictions. The Word we preached was touching the very heart of man even unto the *'dividing asunder of soul and spirit and of the joints and marrow'* where nothing else could reach whether biological, chemical, psychological or philosophical. So our system grew and covered the entire continent of Australia. Other countries had similar experiences.

Giants only travel on major routes, roads and highways; and they only travel on routes which they are familiar with. That's why we had to devise our own international routes for funds transfers, travel, communication, etc. Whenever I traveled on the same route with them I made sure to travel under one of my 14 pair of names. For instance, our agreement with Solomon Islands Government (SIG) was signed under the name of Dr. Samuel Miikaii. Later in 2003 when the PNG government issued a warrant of arrest to extradite Mr. Noah Musingku the S.I.G replied that they had no such name in their official register. The matter was put to rest!

Giants are also too noisy and cannot stop publicizing themselves. Although the U-Vistract system is designed to directly tackle and replace the conventional/corrupt system with a godly system we do so with much tact, wisdom and gentleness. The Bible commands us to "be wise/cunning as serpents and as gentle as doves" (Matt 10:16). In this way we can defeat our giants so easily. They are like bread for us. Wisdom, skill and gentleness are some weapons which giants fear most.

In summary let me state that the greatest weapon of mass destruction/construction available to mankind is to let God fight the battle for us. The battle is the Lord's, the victory is ours! A life that is totally surrendered to God is the way to go. A life of total consecration or total sanctification unto God is indeed a life of power! For instance, after our arrival home we have so far seen several giants removed from the land. All we do is advance and let God remove the giants at the rate of our progress! # U-V To Encompass the World

**A vision is based on ideology, and U-Vistract organization vision is to encompass the world with its system Government and Monetary and Banking system.**

U-V Principal Director, HM King David Peii II, is adamant that U-V is here to stay and grow to encompass the world despite all opposition.

He said in Panguna, rumors also circulated that Ramsi will come to attack, but he assured late King Francis O.D.D Domanaa, that it will not happen.

## U-V Expansion Strategy

**"My System of Government must go hand-in-hand with my funds, and if countries want my money, they must accept my system", says Principal Director of U-Vistract, HM King David Peii II.**

"I have found that many nations want my money, but they do not want my system.

"My stand is that, if they want my money, they must also accept my system", he says.

The King of the Papala Kingdom on Bougainville revealed this while discussing the expansion activities of the U-V Government, Finance and Banking system around the world.

"I have appointed my Chief Governors and Governor Generals in Papua New Guinea and Solomon Islands with Chief Governors for Fiji, Vanuatu and United Kingdom, while I've appointed Ambassadors to many other countries where we are

in the process of establishing our embassies", he said.

"We have appointed our own Governor Generals, chief governors, provincial governors, administrators, ambassadors, trade commissioners, auditor generals and bank governors, as we advance", he said.

"My Solomon Islands Governor General is the former conventional Governor General, Sir George Leping", he said.

The King added that his Government and Finance must go together, and if countries and nations want his money, they must implement his system.

He has signed agreements for financial assistance to Solomon Islands and United States, who are holding their cheques to cash them when his monetary system comes on line.

The King said the others waiting to sign agreements with U-V include

many of which have already had their Ambassadors appointed by the King, waiting to take up their appointment.

The King recently approved USD 164 million, for the establishment of embassies in Malaysia, Singapore, Philippines, Washington DC, London UK, Canada, France, Taiwan, Switzerland and Indonesia.

And, he appointed Sir Uwau Imani as Regional Governor for the Asia/Pacific Region to be based in Singapore, while the Asia Pacific Forum Governor covering Solomon Islands, Fiji, New Caledonia, and Vanuatu is Sir Ekonia Sios. *pc*
